WILL THE CHURCH BE OPEN THIS SUNDAY?

That is a question which has been asked a lot since the Scottish Government announced that places of Worship can begin to reopen on July 15 for *congregational services, including pre-arranged or scheduled acts of worship and communal prayer.* Of course, the truth of the matter is that the Church has never really been closed. For sure, the doors may have been shut and congregational services may have been suspended, but Wilson Memorial has been continuing to function as a Church in a whole variety of new and different ways, and in some ways is actually thriving and growing. While we may love our building, we all know that the Church is not confined to the bricks and mortar, but comprises each and everyone of us who love Jesus wherever we are. As the old children's hymns goes, 'The Church is not a building/The Church is not a steeple/The Church is not a resting-place/The Church is the people/ I am the Church/You are the Church/We are the Church together/All who follow Jesus/All around the world/Yes, we're the Church together.'

That said, we know how anxious you all are to be able to gather and worship together. However, as has been said several times before, our *congregational services* will not be as we once knew. If you have attended any of our twice-weekly times of *individual prayer*, *quiet reflection*, and *silent meditation* on Wednesday and Saturday, you will see that our sanctuary looks very different. In a space in which we could accommodate 100 seats, we are now only able to provide 20 seats because of the 2 metre *physical distancing* measures we are required to observe. We are also having to operate a one-way system throughout the entire Church building, and strict hygiene measures are in place. The names and contact details of every person entering our Church building have to be recorded for *Test And Protect* purposes.

As you can imagine the KAIROS TEAM (this was the Team appointed by the Session to lead and coordinate our response to COVID-19) have worked extremely hard to ensure that we met all of the Scottish Government guidelines before recommending to the Session that we opened the Church for *individual prayer, guiet reflection*, and *silent meditation* on July 4.

The Scottish Government guidelines for the safe opening of *places of worship for congregational services* was only published on Tuesday, July 14, and the KAIROS TEAM will need to take some time to consider all the requirements and their implications for our safe opening of our Church for *congregational services*. So, the answer to the question, '*Will The Church Be Open This Sunday?*' is NO. However, rest assured that the KAIROS TEAM and the Session will continue to work hard towards that goal.

As we begin to plan, here are some of the things that the Scottish Government guidelines that we will need to consider and follow:

- Conduct A COVID-19 Risk Assessment based on current guidelines and legislation.
- Physical Distancing currently 2 metres, one-way system, signage etc.
- O Hygiene Safeguards hand sanitiser, cleaning after every service, etc.
- Data Collection Test and Protect
- Maximum Numbers Who Can Attend 50 (although, our space only allows for 25-30 at 2 metres apart)
- Restricted Use Of Toilets only one person at a time in the Toilet areas, clean after every use.
- O Bibles/Books of Praise to be removed (BYOB Bring Your Own Bible)
- No congregational singing
- Soloists to sing behind a glass/plexiglass screen)
- O No Food or Drink unless it is essential to the act of worship
- People in Higher Risk those who are in high risk health and/or shielding categories are advised to stay at home.

As you can see there is a great deal to consider, so we would value your continued prayers and support as the KAIROS TEAM and the Session endeavour to lead us forward to the next stage of embracing our 'new normal'.
