## CHRISTMAS 2020: NOT YOUR 'NORMAL' CHRISTMAS

In all my years of Christian ministry I don't think I have ever heard politicians or government leaders talk as much about Christmas than they have this year. But then, 2020 has not been a normal year. The COVID-19 global pandemic has changed the lives of us all, and will continue to do so for quite some considerable time. We are thankful for the recent news about the vaccines, and we trust that they will prove to be as effective as we all hope they will be. However, in the meantime, we endeavour to live our lives as best we can, trusting that, in the words of the poet Seamus Heaney, 'if we winter this one out, we can summer anywhere.'

This Christmas will not be 'normal'. But what actually constitutes a 'normal' Christmas? The first Christmas was far from 'normal'. Even in first century rural Palestine it wasn't 'normal' for babies to be born in hollowed out caves, or for their first bed to be an animal feeding trough. Nor was it 'normal' for such supernatural phenomena to occur, before, during, or after a child's birth. Neither of my children when they were new-born were visited by peasant workers, or members of the 'inteligencia' bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh when they were born. Christmas wasn't 'normal' then, so why would we expect it to be normal now? In fact, that's the whole point about Christmas: nothing will ever be 'normal' again. How could it be? Christmas was intended to turn everything 'normal' on its head: to turn the world upside down. It is one of the wonderful ironies about Christmas, that what we think of as 'normal', is actually 'abnormal'. people were far from 'normal' when Jesus was born, which was why Jesus came. God's version of 'normal' is represented by the imagery of Genesis 1 and 2: a perfect world where men and women lived as equals, creation was honoured and respected, and God lived in close proximity with all that He had created. That is what constitutes 'normal' in God's eyes. But, that 'normal' was shattered by disobedience, and what was perfect became imperfect, and humanity lost its true humanity. Over time we became used to the 'abnormal', and eventually it became our 'new' normal. Jesus came to remind us of what is truly 'normal', where the least become the greatest, the first become the last, the spiritually blind become those who see, the hungry are fed, and the mark of our true humanity is revealed in how we love one another.

For the world, this Christmas will not be 'normal', but for those of us who love and follow Jesus, this Christmas has the potential to be our greatest yet. Stripped of all that has been accrued to it throughout the centuries, perhaps this year is the year when we see Christmas as it truly is: an invitation to embrace God's 'normal' in new and innovative ways.

## CHRISTMAS AT HOME, ONLINE AND IN-PERSON

As you will all be aware, the Scottish government, along with the UK government, has announced that certain current COVID-19 restrictions will be lifted during the period of December 23 to December 27 to allow people to visit with an extended number of family and friends. The travel restrictions will also be eased during the same period, allowing people to travel to visit family and friends in other areas of the country. This inevitably will lead to a



greater number of personal contact with a greater number of people. In order to allow our Church family to engage more safely with their own families and friends during this period, the Session have made the decision to suspend all 'in-person' services during the period of December 23 to December 27. This, therefore, means that some of our regular Christmas services will either not take place, or they will happen on-line, or in your own home.
